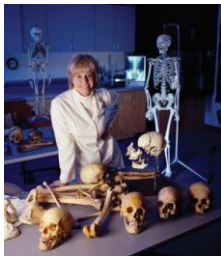


Career Investigation By Maria Soto

Anthropologists

My first career choice was Anthropology. Major tasks that Anthropologists do is: study the origin, physical, social, and cultural development and behavior of humans. They also examine and recover material evidence including ruins of building, tools, pottery, and other objects from the past. The research of evolution of the human body and the language is another thing they do. They also examine human remains.



Anthropologists work regular hours and either work alone behind a desk or work with only some people. Some unpleasant aspects of this job are that most Anthropologists work overtime and are not compensated.

In 2006 there were 18,000 job occupations for this career. Most Anthropologists

work for: federal, state and local governments, colleges, and universities.

The preferred level of education for this job is a master's degree. This job is expected to increase 10% by 2016. The average yearly earnings vary from \$49,930-\$62,990.

Archivists

My second career choice was Archivists. Some major tasks that an Archivist performs are to collect, organize, and maintain control of information, handle objects with cultural, biological, or historical significance, and accurately determine records.



Archivists work regular hours and work alone or with other people.

In 2006 there were 27,000 job occupations for this career. Most Archivists work for museums, universities, or colleges.

The preferred level of education for this job is a bachelor's degree. This job is expected to grow 18% in 2016. The average yearly earnings vary from \$30,610-\$53,990.

Fashion Designer

My last career choice was a Fashion Designer. Some tasks that they perform are to create clothing, study fashion trends, and create different designs for many items.

Fashion Designers work regular hours and they work with many people. Some unpleasant aspects of this job are that they work long hours to finish their work and are under constant pressure.

In 2006 there were 20,000 jobs in this occupation. Most Fashion Designers work in corporate offices.

This job is expected to grow 5% by 2016. The average yearly earnings vary from \$42,140-\$62,610.
